FY24 Funding Status of FY2024 Spending

- House and Senate draft spending bills
- House Republicans want \$119 billion in cuts
 - Decreases for Departments of Agriculture, Commerce, Justice, Interior, Labor, Health/Human Services and Education

High investment in FY2024 Earmarks

- FY2023 \$16 billion for Earmarks
- FY2024 84% of House members requested earmarks | 66% of Senators requested projects

Recent Earmark Trends

Earmarks can offer a new funding stream for some institutions of higher education.

Total FY23 earmark funding for colleges and universities	Over \$1.7 billion
Number of colleges funded	Nearly 550
Median funding amount for all HED projects	\$1.25 million
Range of funding for HED projects	\$100K - \$113 million
