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## **Key Components of By-Laws**

- > General (Name and location, mission, When established)
- > Clarifying responsibilities (President/Board, Faculty, et al.)
- > Board membership (Terms, Leadership, Emeritus/a status)
- > Board meetings (Number, timing, retreats)
- > Standing committees (Focus on Executive Committee)

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> Other (Conflict of interest, indemnification, by-law changes)



# **Pitfalls and opportunities**

- > Less is more (Be careful with specific constituencies and causes)
- > Review regularly and share widely
- > Align board and president roles and responsibilities

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- > Name board's commitment to self-evaluation
- > Be careful with the Executive Committee



# (Shared) Governance

> From equal rights, rules of engagement, and consult before deciding, to *institutional thinking*, alignment on priorities (Bahls)

> Critical for the Board to clearly define the roles of all constituencies and to describe how decisions are made – a board statement on shared governance

- > Transparency is key and communication is critical
- > Regular temperature taking on governance can avoid crises



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# Some best practices for governance

- > Name shared governance as a priority have a shared governance mindset
- > Build social capital between board, faculty, and administrators
- > Support programs to strengthen faculty self-governance
- > Respect traditional rules of faculty engagement
- > Make difficult decisions graciously and courageously
