#### Impact of New Administration

- Overhaul of Triad
  - oElimination of USDOE

#### Impact of New Administration

- Enhanced CTE support
- Immigration enforcement

- Elimination of USDOE
  - oProject 2025 "Federal education policy should be limited and, ultimately, the federal Department of Education should be eliminated."
  - Post-election statements
  - Likely impact for IHEs is a substantial dispersion of regulatory authority and some significant limits on OCR activity

- Accreditation reform
  - Preclude use of TIV role to mandate DE&I initiatives
  - Protect state sovereignty by limiting accreditors' influence over public institutions' governance
  - Protect faith-based institutions (FBIs) by limiting accreditors' ability to:
    - Establish policies at odds with FBIs' religious beliefs
    - Intrude on FBIs' governance
  - Possibly eliminate accreditors from Triad

- Accreditation reform (cont'd)
  - New accreditors are encouraged
  - oExecutive order directing DOJ to pursue antitrust claims against accreditors, especially the ABA

- Enhanced role for state regulators
  - Enable state regulators to recognize accreditors to serve as TIV gatekeepers
  - Authorize state agencies to act as accreditors for institutions throughout the U.S.

#### Restructuring of Financial Aid

- Consider privatizing all lending programs
- Terminate the Public Service Loan Forgiveness program
- Modify HEA to eliminate or reduce USDOE's ability to forgive TIV loans
- Eliminate BDR process in favor of allowing only traditional fraud claims in connection with student's enrollment or educational program

#### Title IX Regulations Update

- Injunctions in pending litigation resulted in patchwork enforcement
- USDOE continues efforts to enforce 2024 regulations in non-injunction states
- Expect immediate efforts to change USDOE enforcement efforts after January 20
- Special focus on defining "sex" as meaning only biological sex recognized at birth

#### OCR Reform

- Transfer to Department of Justice
- Permit enforcement only through litigation

#### **Loper Bright Implications**

- Profoundly consequential SCOTUS decision
- Administrative agencies no longer entitled to Chevron deference
- Potential impact for IHEs, especially when coupled with WV v. EPA
  - ∘Title IX
  - oInterpretation of financial aid regulations
  - oInterpretation of Title VI issues

#### Financial Stresses

- Consider fiduciary duty obligations of officers and trustees
- Endowment management under UPMIFA
- Downsizing/restructuring/eliminating programs
  - Faculty handbook issues
  - Early exit plans
- Dealing with the Triad
- Timing issues are critical

#### The Wild World of Sports

- Recent NCAA changes
  - NIL Rules
  - Transfer Portal
- Results
  - oFinancial arms race
  - Virtually no rules on federal level, but substantial state activity
- Future No one knows

#### Proposed FLSA Overtime Rule Changes

- Injunction of the OT Final Rule issued November 15
- Rolls back the July increase and planned January increase
- Back to minimum salary threshold of \$35,568 per year
- Next steps under Trump?

#### **Unionization Efforts**

- Trump impact
- More employer friendly NLRB Decisions, but . . .
- Campus unionization efforts likely to continue
- Proactive efforts to address organizers' efforts

#### Gainful Employment/FVT Rules

- Extension for required FVT/GE reporting and review of the Completers Lists by January 15, 2025
- Serious consequences for non-compliance

#### Really Hot Topics



- US News–Harris December 2023 poll of 2,000 Americans
  - 63% believe that IHEs are not handling antisemitism on campus effectively
  - o60% believe that colleges and university presidents should be dismissed from their jobs
  - o 60% believe they are prioritizing donors, press and other external factors over students

- US News-Harris (cont'd)
  - o80% of Americans say that IHEs are more worried about their endowment than creating leaders of tomorrow
  - Nearly 80% of them say that if colleges and universities don't become more accessible to all people and emphasize diversity, then the leaders of tomorrow will all be the same.

- Gallup-Lumina June 2024 poll of 2,000 Americans
   Declining confidence in IHEs
  - 2015 57% had great deal/quite a lot of confidence
  - 2024 36% had great deal/quite a lot of confidence
  - Republican decline even greater
    - 2015 56% with great deal/quite a lot of confidence
    - 2024 20% confident and 50% have little or no confidence

- Conclusions
  - The substantial majority of Americans believe
     IHEs and their leaders are AWFUL
  - That perspective will cause legislators, regulators, judges, and jurors to create a difficult legal environment in the coming years
  - Higher ed has many fences to mend with our fellow citizens
